## Who we are

We’re Heath and Salvatore. We live in Bloomfield, a charming neighborhood nestled between downtown, East Liberty, and Oakland, with two cats (Penelope and Jasonas) and a small dog (Fritz). Our house overlooks a small park, and is filled with flowers, books, good music, and delicious Italian food.

Salvatore is originally from Northern Italy, where his family still lives. His mother and father are still married after 50 years, and so we go to visit them every summer, taking the opportunity to also see Salvatore’s older brother and sister. Salvatore loves to read, play videogames, and walk around Pittsburgh to discover charming hidden little places, roads, and older buildings. He is a socio-legal scholar who studies pirates and hackers, and he loves to talk about them.

## What our lives are like

We both teach at Pitt, so our work schedules are very flexible, and we spend much of our time working from home, since we are not required to maintain a constant physical presence on campus. This will enable us both to engage closely in childcare.

We are thrilled to have settled down in Pittsburgh where we have found a community and sense of home. In the park in front of our house people walk, run, picnic, and play, and there are playgrounds, basketball, and tennis courts nearby. There are many excellent schools, and we generally walk to do grocery shopping and to the many stores and restaurants nearby (though we also have a car). We have many friends in our neighborhood – including our neighbors on both sides.

Any child who we will be lucky to bring in our home will spend time in the fresh air, in the water, and in the mountains. We would also hope to teach a child other languages and expose them to different cultures, both in our community and through travel. We are both artistic and grew up playing musical instruments (these days we love karaoke!), and we would encourage a child to explore any artistic interest they might have. We also understand the benefits that organized sports can give, but we would never impose a hobby or interest on a child; it is important that they also carve out their own path.
