As Parents

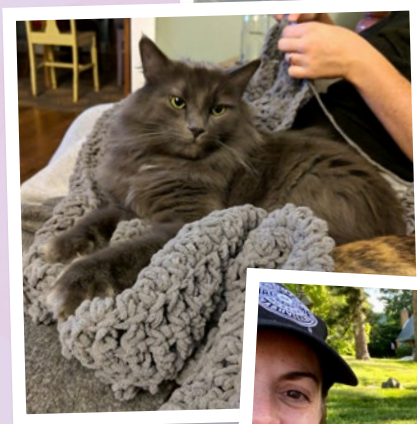
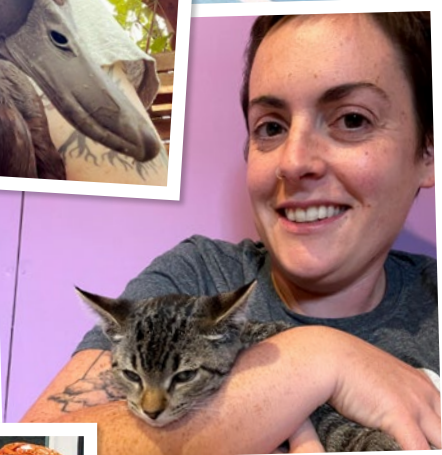
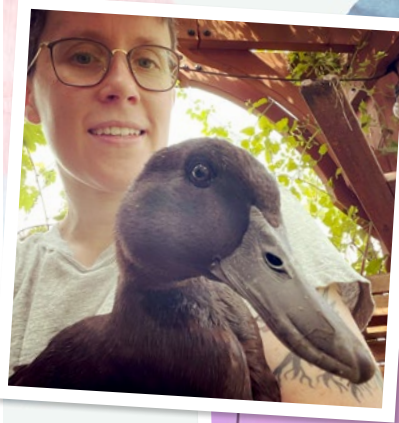
