We are fortunate to both have adoption in our families so we're not just at peace with adopting, we are celebrating that this is our path to parenthood. We feel blessed to be able to add a child to our lives and honored that you are considering us to be adoptive parents to yours.

Natalie: I've always thought about being a mother and I know it's because of my parents, grandparents, and extended cultural community. I get my morals and need to nurture from my mom, my sense of humor and love for cooking from my dad. My younger brother and I have so many memories with our paternal grandparents, who were local, as well as our maternal grandparents that lived in California, after immigrating to the U.S. from Serbia.

I think of the love they all showed me throughout my life and how I want to be the kind of mother my mom was to me: generous, adoring, and committed to showing me all the world has to offer. And someday, I want to be the kind of grandmother like the two I had; passing it on to children of my own is the best way to honor their memories. My parents are overjoyed at the prospect of their first grandchild!

Growing up in the Serbian community and culture enriches my life daily. It gave me a profound sense of who I am because I knew where I came from; it's why I believe in open adoption, should you feel that's best for you too. Bo now joins me in celebrating a lot of the traditions that are foundational to who I am. He chose to get baptized in the church that my great-grandparents helped to build. I have several cousins who both are, and have, adopted children themselves. A few friends of mine were adopted and have shared with me the unique adult perspective on how the process changed their lives. Watching my peers become parents in recent years, I want that for myself: the unconditional love of a child that calls you "Mom," helping them find who they are, seeing them grow up – just the thought of it fills me with this glow of excitement. I became a godmother to my best friend's daughter last year, and it's a joy I didn't know existed, being a part of her life.

I know how much happier and full my life is because I get to share it

with Bo, and I truly believe that beauty would only magnify with the addition of children in our home. I want to share the love I grew up with and foster it within my own family life, and I'm here for the ups, the downs and personal growth that come from getting to raise - and know - this unique child.
